HERO Posts - a learning update is coming soon!

As we have indicated earlier in the year, one of the benefits of HERO is real-time reporting. All staff are working with students to prepare their first learning post around their goals for the end of next week (Friday 7th August). We are looking at a learning post every 3 weeks. Generally the posts will focus on literacy (reading, writing or both) or maths and relate to the goals that can be found in your child's HERO profile. It is our intention that students will be responsible for their own post, with the exception of our Year 1 and 2 students who will work with their teacher to make posts. I am sure you will agree that this is an exciting next step in our implementation of HERO.

HERO App

There was some discussion at the PTA meeting last night about the need to log into HERO every time a notification / newsletter comes through. When you click on the link you will need to log in... HOWEVER,



there is an easier way... Do not OPEN the link Do not COLLECT \$200 GO straight to the app* and open that READ at your leisure

> *The app needs to be running and not swiped closed. If it is closed, you will need to log in. I am in contact with the site developers to see what they can do as a better solution but obviously maintaining privacy is vitally important, hence the need to regularly log in.

Safe access to school

Again thank you for your cooperation around parking legally outside the school. I have noticed that some of our junior families park on the left hand side of Kohia Terrace and walk their children across the road to access the junior gate. We do have patrols on the pedestrian crossing for a reason, so ask that children use it, with a parent or even better, independently. As per the guidelines on the <u>AA site</u> regarding 'using pedestrian crossings safety': "Pedestrians must use a signalised pedestrian crossing or zebra crossing if within 20 metres of it". It teaches them good habits, abides by the law, and is safer. We thank you in advance for your attention to this.
