We realise that every student, and indeed every parent, would like these awards. Our cornerstone badges acknowledge four students in each class (Years 1 - 7) for one of the following:

- Reaching for the Sky
- Excelling through Effort
- Nurturing our Human Spirit
- Leading the Way

These cornerstones are the basis of our values and are not about the most improved or the top academic student in each class. As a school we acknowledge students who have demonstrated excellence around one of our four cornerstones. What informs those decisions is linked on the website <u>Cornerstone Award Criteria</u>. Teachers can usually identify a number of students within their class who demonstrate the key elements of each cornerstone. We do take into account recent previous recipients as we balance equity with excellence. However, there are some children in the school who may receive three or even four badges over their eight years at KTS, and some who will not receive any.

There are also a number of major school awards (cups) awarded each year for students in Year 3, Year 6 and Year 8. Information on these are also on the school website <u>Special Awards Criteria</u>.
