It has been an interesting weekend as the country works to reduce the risk of a country-wide spike in coronavirus cases. We do have a pandemic plan in place and are working to ensure learning can be maintained if the school were to close.

The Board of Trustees is holding a special meeting on Wednesday (18th March) around the school's plans and preparations going forward.

In the meantime, what can you do to help?

- 1. Please do not send your children to school if they are unwell.
- 2. Please ensure you have the access details to Mathletics and Reading Eggs or Reading Express. If we were to close, these two programmes will be essential to maintain learning along with other links, which we will send out if and when required.

Assembly and other matters

We are going to be proceeding with school assembly at this stage. Following Ministry of Education advice, we are going to be splitting the assembly with the presenting group attending both. Students will be spread out to maximise the distance between students. This coming Friday Pohutukawa are leading our assemblies with a focus on Maori culture.

We are also going to change classroom organisation to exclude mat time. Students will be asked to sit at desks or on lily pads throughout the day.

We have also asked for the younger children to no longer 'high five' good bye to their teacher.

Lockdown

You will have received a letter yesterday indicating we were having a trial lock down today. This is a necessary part of our emergency action planning each year. Last year, ironically, we practised this on the day of the mosque attacks. One of our key goals was to test out communication methods using Hero. Students responded well to the exercise which we kept short, sharp and calm. Our congratulations to them for the way in which they conducted themselves.

Unfortunately we had all the Year 1 iPads stolen on Saturday night. The burglars broke in through the verandah doors in what we call the sunroom, between Rooms 1 and 2. Very frustrating!
