Year 0 Ballot for Out-of-Zone Enrolments for 2020

Kohia Terrace School will be holding a Ballot on Friday 19th June 2020 for out-of-zone enrolments for 2020 Year 0 entrants.

Year 0 is for children who will turn 5 on or after 1 June 2020

The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

Applicants are accepted in this order:

- 1. first priority must be given to any applicant who is accepted for enrolment in a special programme run by the school
- 2. second priority must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school
- 3. third priority must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school
- 4. fourth priority must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school
- 5. fifth priority must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school
- 6. sixth priority must be given to all other applicants.

Applications for enrolments for students living out of zone must be submitted before 12pm Wednesday 17th June 2020. You must complete this <u>online application form</u>.

Please do not complete our full enrolment form until you have been offered and have accepted a place as an out-of-zone student for Year 0 2020.
