Mana Tangata – enhancing the potential of all

One initiative within our Community of Schools this year is exploring ways that we can support our Multilingual Language Learners. This is strongly driven by Mana Tangata – our desire to enhance the potential of all our learners. Our major focus this term has been working with teachers from Kohia Terrace and Remuera Primary School to share ideas and resources to engage all students in developing language skills. We are creating a shared learning resource for all teachers to use and add teaching ideas such as using visual supports in the classroom to back up spoken instructions. It has been an exciting opportunity for our teachers to share and celebrate how they work to meet the needs of our students' diverse learning needs.




Some of the many ways that our teachers are enhancing language development and learning are:

- greetings in different languages each day
- using talk and actions for writing
- online tools which translate and read aloud texts in different languages (Unite for Literacy)
- props used to back up actions in class
- using ScreenCast, Educreate (recorded whiteboard) or video so that lessons can be re-watched by students at any time.

Out-of-zone ballot

Kohia Terrace School will be holding a Ballot on Wednesday 21st October 2020 for out-of-zone enrolments. The Board has determined that places are likely to be available for out-of-zone students for Priority 2–6 in the following year levels: **Year 0** (children who will turn 5 on or after 1 June 2021); **Year 1** and **Year 2**. We will also be accepting ballot applications for **Priority 2 only** in **Years 3 and 5**.

The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

The closing date for out-of-zone applications will be Wednesday 14th October 2020.

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also enrol by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year. Please refer to our [school website](#) for further information.
