#### **Board of Trustees Update**

The Board held their October meeting last week. Please remember that the minutes of all our meetings can be found on the school website.

#### **Community Survey Results**

The Board have spent some time analysing the results of their recent community survey. The full summary is available on request but for those more interested in an overview, here are the key points:

#### <u>General</u>

- Overall response rates are in line with previous years
- It was encouraging to see that responses reflected all year groups
- We are conscious that the planned consultation evening with the Chinese community, where we would have gone through the survey in person, did not proceed due to COVID restrictions
- The overwhelming message from the parents is extremely positive. It is clear that Kohia Terrace School remains a school of choice, and that parents are proud to be part of our community

#### <u>Values</u>

• There were a number of suggestions, including reference to our current school values, which the Board and school will consider as we review our curriculum

#### Specialist teaching

- The community clearly value the additional funding spent on specialist teaching over and above what the Ministry of Education provides
- All of the suggestions for specialist teaching received support from the community, but feedback suggests that maths, science and languages are a higher priority for many people compared with music, sport, local history and dance/drama

#### **Communications**

- There is value in continuing to use the newsletter, website and fortnightly email communications
- Many parents see the advantages of HERO
- There are issues regarding log in and navigation within HERO (which the school is endeavouring to address)

#### <u>Strenaths</u>

- The community clearly value the quality of our teachers
- The diversity of the community is valued
- There is a strong sense of community, which is appreciated by all
- The size of the school and its warm and friendly culture is also appreciated

#### Challenaes for the school

- The Board shares the community's concerns about
  - retaining and recruiting quality teachers
  - o the implications of another COVID lockdown
  - o future funding shortfalls
  - potential growth of the school roll

#### What is already being done?

- <u>SchoolApps</u> is being introduced to ensure ease of access to the newsletter as the key method of communication to families
- The Board is working with the Ministry of Education around <u>potential</u> roll growth due to housing development in the school zone
- Of the five outdoor toilets, two have now been allocated to girls, two to boys and one remains gender neutral
- The school is fully staffed for 2021 with some impressive applicants for roles
- The school has reviewed the impact of the COVID lockdowns with staff and students and continues to focus on student wellbeing (a full update on our wellbeing work will follow)

#### What next?

- The Board and Senior Leadership Team are reviewing the feedback around the school values and will
  prepare a document for community consultation
- Funding for specialist teachers and teacher aide classroom support will continue to be reviewed subject to funding availability from donations, government and fundraisers
- The Board will more regularly consult with the community around key policy and procedure changes
