# Traffic on Kohia Terrace – thank you

After my email requesting that parents respect the road rules we have seen a significant improvement at the start and end of the school day. We really appreciate, as our neighbours do, your manaakitanga (respect). We do urge students to continue to walk home if they can, or for parents to park away from the school to avoid that congestion around the school gate.

We have asked our road patrollers to wait until there is a group of students to cross to limit the frequency of signs being put out as a way of trying to maintain traffic flow. Catherine and I are meeting with the police and Auckland Transport on Thursday to talk through other options. Catherine and I will continue to oversee the school gate, heping where we can.

### **Board of Trustees Update**

Finally we approach the end of a long and unusual Term 2. We have all learnt so much, though perhaps not what we expected.

The Board of Trustees would like to thank the Kohia Terrace School Staff for your commitment to the school, during what has been a challenging time.

Thank you to our teachers, who rapidly adapted and upskilled to manage the distance learning programme, adjusting to the needs of different families. Thank you to our teacher aides and specialist teachers, who have supported students and teachers in various ways. Thank you to our office staff; grounds staff; cleaning staff and all other staff who have adapted to changing hours and responsibilities over this time. That your work was done while also managing commitments within your own household "bubbles" is a credit to you all.

Thank you to Alison and the Senior Leadership Team for responding to frequent updates from the Ministries of Education and Health with your usual calm and coordinated approach. Communication with parents has been clear throughout the different Lockdown Levels. We know that the wellbeing of our children has been your priority during your tireless work.

Thank you to those parents who offered feedback during Lockdown Levels 3 and 4. We have since had student focus groups to gain their perspective on the distance learning programme, and staff feedback has also been sought so that, moving forward, we can continue to use the most successful digital technologies and teaching strategies. Our extended 3-way learning conferences this term will continue these conversations.

In Term 3 we will undertake our biennial staff and parent surveys. Parents will be asked for opinions on a range of key topics. Your input is very important to us, as a guide to our decision-making. While your answers remain anonymous, a summary of the results will be shared in the school newsletter.

One of our COVID-related challenges this year is a reduction in income, both from a reduced number of international students, and a reduction in parent donations compared with that expected for the year to date. This does have an effect on the staff, facilities, and programmes we can offer in the school.

You may have noticed new School Signage on the field. We are now able to advertise school events, but there is also room for you to book advertising space. This is available at a reasonable rate – please enquire via the Office – so that KTS families and those caught in Gillies Ave traffic can see your advertisement.

We are excited to introduce Sarah Heares, manager of our new After School and Holiday programme. This is now run by and for Kohia Terrace School, with any profit returning to our school.

#### myKindo changes to POLi payments (instant bank transfers)

We have been advised that a service fee of 1% (capped at \$3) will apply for myKindo topups using POLi (instant bank transfers) from 6 July 2020. Internet banking continues to be FREE.

You will see these top-up options:

- Internet Banking (POLi) will incur a 1% service fee (capped at \$3). Funds are instantly transferred.
- Credit/Debit Card will incur 2.5% and 50c service fee. Funds are instantly transferred. Visa, Mastercard, American Express, China Union Pay.
- Internet Banking (at your bank) FREE. Allow two days for processing of funds (normally next day). Orders can be automatically placed when the funds have cleared. Kindo is a Registered

Bill Payee with all major banks (search 'Kindo' to avoid entering their bank account number when using internet banking).

You can set up an Auto Payment or top up additional funds to your myKindo balance to avoid topping up each time, which will streamline your next purchase if you'd like to do so. Questions? <u>hello@mykindo.co.nz</u>
