We will continue updating the school website as updates arrive from the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health.


Music Programme 2020

HERO for parents

On Friday, I sent out information on how to access the app for HERO and how to register. It is vital that all parents use the app, whether that be on a smartphone or your computer. This will be the key tool for communication of notices, newsletters etc, to check on financial matters (in a week or so) and in Term 2 to track your child's learning progress in reading, writing and maths.

Student leadership positions

As we have quite a number of our senior students on a 14-day quarantine, we are going to wait until Monday 17th February to organise our house captain, sports captain and library captain roles for 2020. We will also be appointing the house representative, sports and library leaders and the tech leaders.

This year, we are also going to limit the house representative roles to Year 6 and 7 students only. The house reps, along with the house captains, will form the basis of the student council who will be organising and running school events with the aim of strengthening school spirit and adding that sense of house competition from time to time.

Blanket Consent

We are implementing a blanket consent for all students for 2020. There are two forms, one for Year 1 -3 students, and one for Year 4 -8 students. A blanket consent means permission is gained now for the conditions outlined below. We will still notify you **when** students are going on these various trips, but you will not have to give permission **per trip**. These forms will come home with students today.

<u>Year 1 – 3</u>

Students to attend trips in the local area such as Epsom Library, Melville Park, Mt Eden Village, Maungawhau **by foot.** If a bus is required, consent will be required per trip as before.

<u>Year 4 – 8</u>

Students to attend

- Sport Zones events
- Excursions within the Auckland area e.g. Epsom Library, Melville Park, Kelly Tarltons, Maungawhau, Auckland Museum
- Visits to local schools for sporting or learning exchange
