

Meet the Teacher

Although we could not have our on-site Meet the Teacher evening last week, we have decided to go with a technological alternative. Rather than just cancelling, we are really committed to ensuring you have good information about how the classes your children are in will operate this year and you have an opportunity to meet the teaching team.

Parent Liaisons – we would love you to get involved

Our parent liaisons for each class or year group are a vital tool in ensuring that sense of school community that we pride ourselves on grows. Riding bikes and scooters

We are loving seeing the number of students riding bikes or scooters to school each day. It saves so much traffic congestion around the school and is such a great way to start and finish a day. According to the Code for Cycling with NZTA you must wear a helmet when riding a bike. This is in line with the school's <u>Road Safety Procedure</u> – the relevant sections are copied below.

Cyclists

- A cycle helmet <u>must</u> be worn at all times (providing it has been well maintained and meets the required standards)
- > The helmet must be adjusted correctly and securely fastened
- > All bicycles must be walked in/out of the school grounds and across the pedestrian crossings
- > Bikes must be stored in the bike stand provided.
- > Students are responsible for providing and using a lock to secure their bike
- As recommended in the Transport Agency Code for Cyclists, **children from the age of 11** can ride unsupervised.
- > Biennial bike safety programmes run by the Police will be delivered

Scooters

- Scooters will be stored in the designated areas
- Parents are encouraged to supply a lock system for security purposes
- > Students are encouraged to wear a helmet
- > Scooters/e-scooters will be walked in and out of the school grounds as well as across the pedestrian crossings
- No charging for e-scooters will be offered at school

Our first camp of the year gets underway next week with the Year 7 & 8 Urban. This camp sees the students experience much of what Auckland has to offer. On Monday they head to Muriwai for a life-saving programme, Wednesday to Wero and Friday to Tiritiri Matangi. It will be a busy but great week I am sure.
