All parents are welcome to join us for this very special ceremony.

I really enjoyed seeing many of you at the gate this morning. It is always good to get back to a normal routine isn't it. Thank you so much to all of you who have purchased school stationery already. If you could have that for the start of next week it would be really appreciated as we will be starting to work in books. I had some queries around school donation and other school costs – you will receive an email from Hero about this tomorrow. Finally, a reminder that all students need a hat to wear at break times and for outside activities every day. From next week, any student without a hat will need to go to Room 3 during break times so that we can follow up individually if necessary.

School renovation update

Work is on track for the completion of the Room 6 and 7 renovation. The Year 3 classes are starting the year in the hall in an open learning environment. We are hopeful we can move to the flexible learning space in Rooms 6 and 7 at the beginning of Week 6 (8th March). Once the work on these classrooms is done we will start on the renovation of Rooms 4 and 5. At this time these classes will move to the hall.

We are pleased to see the reroofing of the main block completed as well as the redevelopment of the deck area by Room 5.

The learning space upstairs by the staffroom has been renovated, creating a really lovely withdrawal space for students. We have also recarpeted the staffroom which has given this space a bit of a spruce up. We are very appreciative.

Meet the Teacher Evening

We look forward to welcoming you on **Thursday 18th February** for our Meet the Teacher evening. The main focus of the meetings this year is to ensure you understand and can access Google Classroom and HERO in case of another lockdown. At the parent meeting in the hall we will be giving a quick outline of our strategic direction before conducting a community consultation around the new school values and competencies.

communicating learning programmes. Your children (Years 2–8) will be accessing this from the start of the year. Please be assured that we are very conscious of the need to balance screen time with book work. ICT User agreements will be coming home in the next few days.

We are looking forward to being back this year to bring you our very own arts programme that your child will love! In Term 1 Antonia will be teaching:

BEACHCOMBING (mixed media painting & drawing on 9 canvas boards)

What do you find when you beach-comb the tide line? A mixture of man-made and natural objects randomly placed by the tide. Textures borrowed from the patterns of nature underlie your artwork. Natural beach objects form the second layer and these in turn are overlaid by found man-made objects to form your third layer. This work is completed on 9 separate canvases that come together to form one masterpiece in the gridded style of John Reynolds.
