

Kohia Terrace School Awards Criteria 2021





Our end of year awards have been refreshed in 2021 to reflect our new values and learner competencies.

Kohia Kaitiaki awards are given at year 3 (one cup), year 6 and year 8, to recognise students who demonstrate our school values of Care and Respect, Persevere to Achieve and Lead with Integrity. See below for more detailed criteria.

KTS Learner Competency badges are awarded to students from years 1-7, replacing the cornerstone badges. One award for each competency is presented to a student in each class (4 badges per class).

Each Year 8 student receives a piece of pounamu to acknowledge the KTS learner competencies that they have developed over their years at the school.

KTS Senior Maths Cup donated by The Geddes Family	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● a creative and efficient mathematician who is a high achiever across all areas of maths (e.g. at or beyond strategy stage 8) ● consistently achieves above expectations for year 8; may score Stanine 9 in relevant PAT assessments, and/or scores an average of over 4 on above 4 on Otago Problem Challenge across the year ● may represent the school as a Mathex team member
KTS Languages Award	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● reaches a consistently high standard in speaking, listening, reading and writing in a second language (other than English, including te reo) ● shows confidence, a positive attitude and willingness to stretch themselves; these qualities are considered above the use accurate spelling and grammar ● uses a wide range of vocabulary, full sentences where appropriate and effectively communicates meaning ● puts effort into all activities related to language and culture within and beyond the classroom e.g. kapa haka, French breakfast
