<p>KTS Languages Award</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • consistently high standard in speaking, listening, reading and writing in a second language (other than English, including te reo) - use of a wide vocabulary, full sentences where appropriate and effective communication of meaning • correct use of spelling and grammar is encouraged but not essential, at this stage fluency is regarded as more important • demonstration of a positive attitude and going the extra mile on activities e.g. kapa haka involvement, home learning, French breakfast
